## COUNT I THOMAS PERRY III

On or about July 9, 2022, in the Second Judicial District of Carroll County, Mississippi, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did unlawfully, willfully, feloniously and with deliberate design to effect death, kill and murder Orlando Pittman, a human being, without authority of law and not in necessary self-defense, in violation of § 97-3-19(1)(a) of the Mississippi code of 1972, as amended, constituting a common plan or scheme or related series of acts or transactions, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Mississippi;

#### COUNT II THOMAS PERRY III

On or about July 9, 2022, in the Second Judicial District of Carroll County, Mississippi, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did unlawfully, willfully, feloniously and maliciously burn or cause to be burned the dwelling house of April Lewis at 411 Court Street, Apt. 14, in violation of § 97-17-1 of the Mississippi code of 1972, as amended, constituting a common plan or scheme or related series of acts or transactions, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Mississippi;

### COUNT III THOMAS PERRY III

On or about July 9, 2022, in the Second Judicial District of Carroll County, Mississippi, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did unlawfully, willfully, feloniously and intentionally with malice torture, mutilate, maim, burn, starve to death, crush, disfigure, drown, suffocate or impale a domesticated dog, in violation of § 97-41-16(2)(b) of the Mississippi code of 1972, as amended, constituting a common plan or scheme or related series of acts or transactions, and against the peace and dignity of the State of Mississippi;
